Tulsa Pattern Contest

Three members of the Springfield RC Club went to the American Turf Flyers Pattern Shootout this past weekend, June 9 and 10, 2007, in Tulsa, Oklahoma. There were 24 competitors from Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Nebraska, and Missouri competing in a sanctioned AMA Radio Controlled Aeobatics event. The Turf Flyers club has purchased a field, maintains it very well, has an air conditioned pavillion with electricity and concrete taxiways to the 40' x 400' runway. The food was excellent with hamburgers and hot dogs for both days, and plenty of liquids, ie., cokes, water, etc. The guys were all helpful and willing to help carry out planes, etc. There were two flight lines for both Saturday and Sunday. There was only one dinger, and that was due to an engine failure on takeoff and a run to the grass which resulted in a broken gear. There were 5 classes of fliers, each of which had to put in 6 flights. This meant that there could have been 144 flights for the two days, but as it goes, several dropped out on Sunday. There were still in excess of 130 flights with only one gear problem.

The weather was warm but not stifling and the wind was manageable. As takeoffs and landings were scored this year, cross winds created some interesting landings. For a perfect takeoff and landing, they had to be centered on the center (judg-



ing) line within 2 1/2 meters. There was a thirty meter area that was used and given credit on landing, for sure.

Our members who went to the contest were George Ashely, Dan Curtis, and Russ Rhodes. George finished in Second

Place in the Intermediate Class, Dan finished in Third Place in the Master's Class and Russ finished first in the Sportsman Class. Two members, George and Russ, had new planes to fly. They both survived in flying colors.
